Greetings:

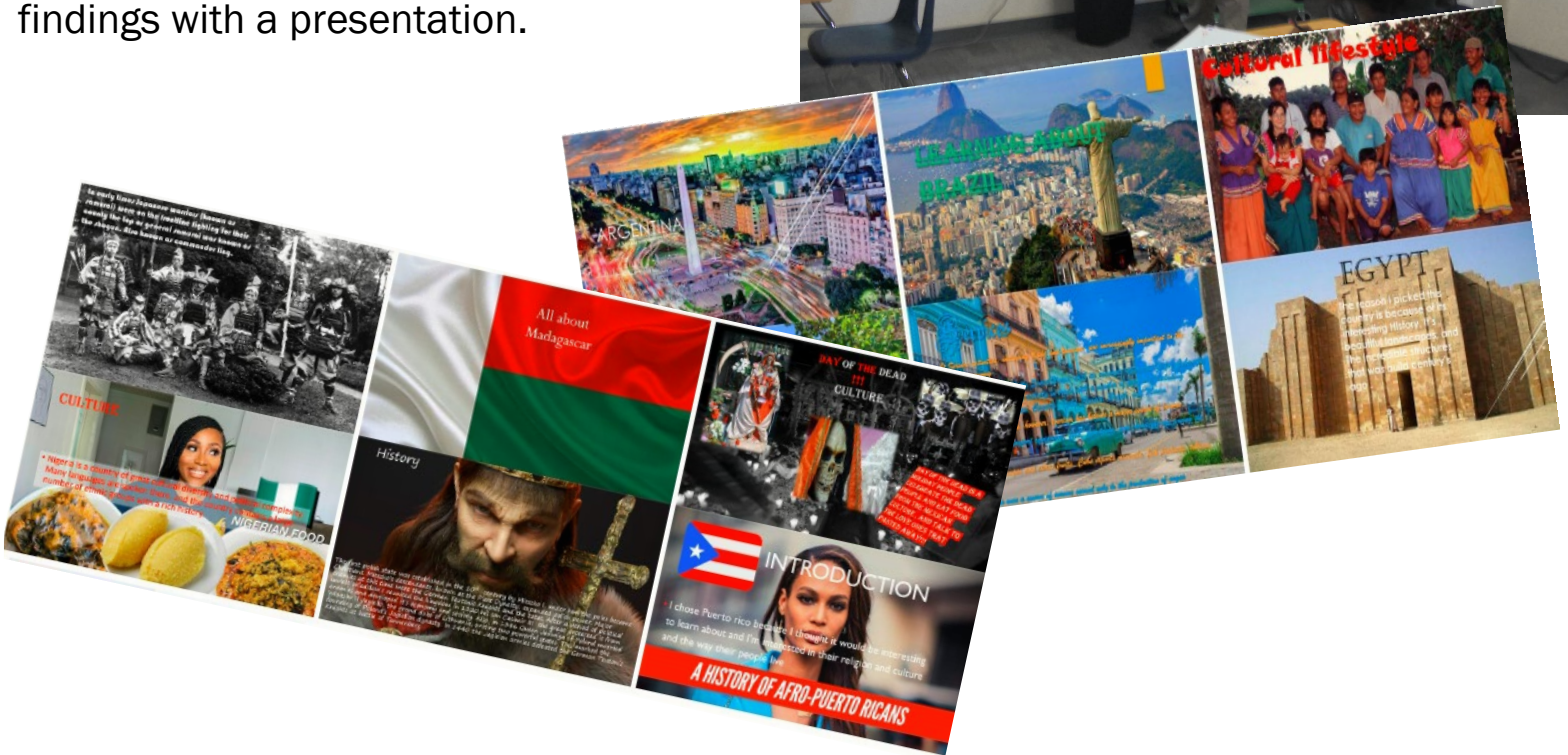

## NUMBERS, NUMBERS, NUMBERS WHAT DO THEY MEAN TO YOU?

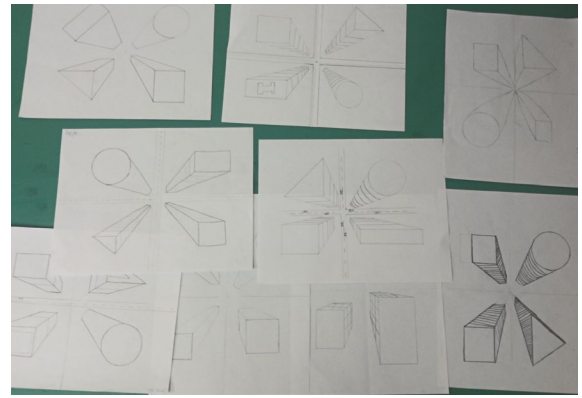
