
What is SEL?


(Social Emotional Learning)

Social-emotional learning (SEL) is the process of developing the self-awareness, self-control, and interpersonal skills that are vital for school, work, and life success. People with strong social-emotional skills are better able to cope with everyday challenges and benefit academically, professionally, and socially. From effective problem-solving to self-discipline, from impulse control to emotion management and more, SEL provides a foundation for positive, long-term effects on kids, adults, and communities.

This methodology is paramount to our mission, vision, and motto. Our students need to develop their emotional intelligence as much as their academic by building trusting relationships and establishing a safe learning.

Some of the routines we have in place to support this initiative are a daily *Mental Health Check-in*, *Social Skills mini lessons*, *Quote of the Day*, and *weekly Motivational Moments*. Coupled with Trauma Based Relational Interventions, our teachers are better equipped to address the social and emotional needs of our students every day.






Spotlight on Math




















Hispanic Heritage
